Rules for Preparing and Submitting a Manuscript to the GeoInfo Journal

The journal accepts original (previously unpublished) scientific and applied-practical articles corresponding to the journal's scope, as well as translated articles by foreign authors published in peer-reviewed international journals under an open license, provided that they have not been translated into or published in Russian before.

Requirements for articles submitted to the GeoInfo Journal:

- 1. Articles are accepted exclusively by e-mail at: info@geoinfo.ru.
- 2. Article length: 4 to 10 pages, Times New Roman, 12 pt font, single line spacing.
- 3. Number of authors: no more than 6.
- 4. The article must comply with the editorial requirements (see below), including: title, abstract (200–250 words), keywords, full name, position, and place of work of all authors, as well as contact details of the corresponding author (including e-mail and full postal address with ZIP code of the workplace), academic degree(s), and academic title(s). All of the above information must be provided in both Russian and English. The translation must be accurate and of high quality; the use of automatic online translators is not permitted.
- 5. UDC code: selected by the author using the reference tool at https://teacode.com/online/udc/.
- 6. The abstract must be informative, containing the purpose and relevance of the research, methods applied by the author, main results, and conclusions.
- 7. The article text must present relevant and practically significant information and should include: an introduction stating the purpose and objectives of the study; a description of the research methodology (methods); a characterization of the study object; the obtained results; their discussion; and conclusions (final remarks).
- 8. At the end of the article, a numbered list of references should be provided in accordance with GOST and the journal's editorial requirements (see sample via link below).
- 9. References in the text should be cited using numbers in square brackets (e.g., [2], [4–6], [2, 7–10, 15]).
- 10. All symbols, abbreviations, and acronyms used in the article must be explained immediately after their first mention in the text, figure, table, or formula. Within the same article, identical parameters must always be denoted in the same way, and different ones in different ways (considering superscripts, subscripts, case, etc.), regardless of the original source.
- 11. Formulas must be accompanied by sequential numbering and explanations (decoding of symbols at their first mention, with units of measurement indicated).
- 12. Units of measurement must be presented in the SI system.
- 13. Figures (including photographs) must have sequential numbering and captions (in both Russian and English). Graphs must include fully labeled axes.
- 14. Tables must have sequential numbering and titles (in both Russian and English).
